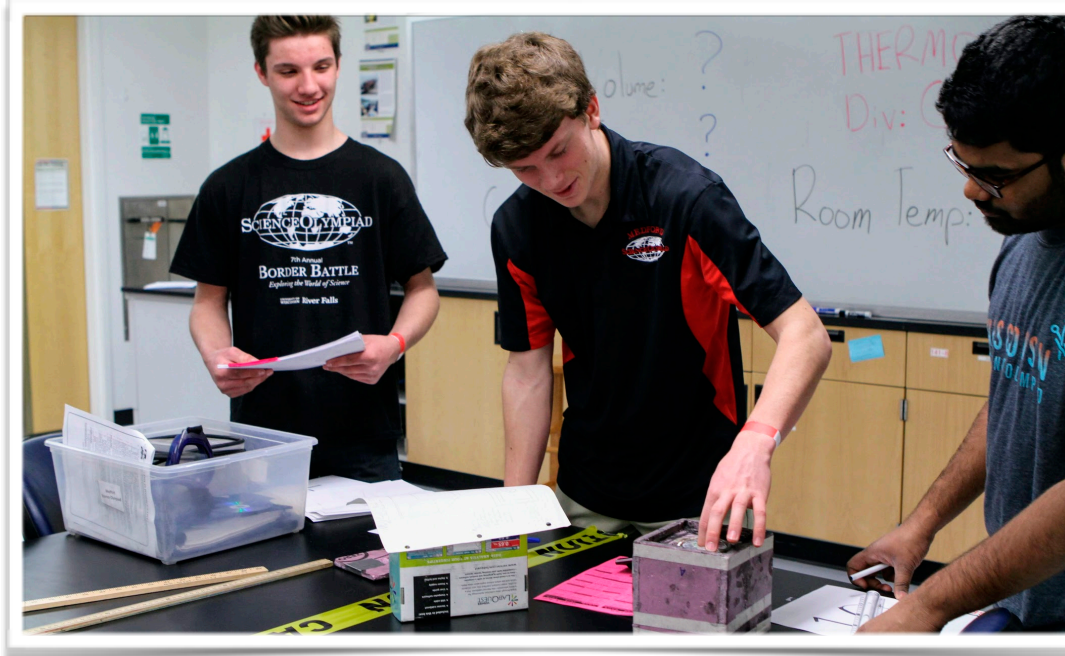




WISCONSIN SCIENCE OLYMPIAD

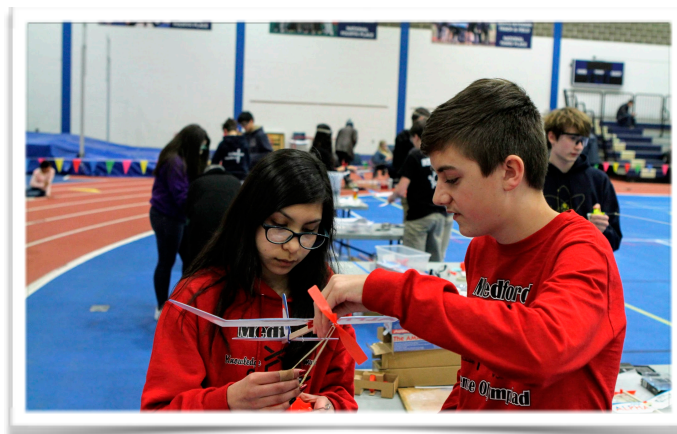
